# Perfect Vision Voluntary Project

VSP Eyes of Hope is working together with Doctors of Optometry, community and charitable partners, and public officials to increase access to eye care and eyewear where it is needed most. During recent catastrophes Eyes of Hope partnered with other non-profit aid groups to provide eyewear and exams to survivors.

After **Hurricane Harvey** they helped 750 teachers and educators who were among those who lost everything, Care was supplied by local doctors, all of whom had practices destroyed or damaged.

After **Hurricane Maria** nearly 200 pediatric patients, their families and the hospital staff received eye care and eyewear. Of those patients who received exams, nearly 70% needed prescription glasses.

Following the **Camp Fire**, a VSP Eyes of Hope mobile clinic was stationed in Chico for two weeks to care for those who were affected by the wildfire and support local VSP network doctors whose practices were damaged. In total, nearly 900 people received access to eye exams and replacement glasses.

As of 2018, Eyes of Hope has provided access to free eye care and eyewear globally for more than 2.5 million in need, including 119,000 people affected by disasters in the US.

There is absolutely <u>no cost to the Sorority</u> to do this special project. Eyes of Hope will supply boxes and mailers to send the glasses to them. AND, for our members who would like to participate - **EYEGLASSES WEIGH NEXT TO NOTHING IN YOUR SUITCASE**.

Boxes will be set up in the back of the meeting room for any donations of eyewear, prescription eyeglasses, frames only, or even sunglasses.

# National Treasurer

I thought I knew my Sorority, but taking on the role of National Treasurer has been an eye opening and rewarding learning experience. I don't think a day goes by that I don't learn something new about Delta Theta Tau. Our National Officers work countless hours to ensure that Delta Theta Tau will continue on long after you and I are gone. But don't you sometimes wonder why they work so hard...

DEADLINES, DEADLINES, DEADLINES. Why so many deadlines??

As we all know Delta Theta Tau, is a charitable, non-profit and fun-loving group of sisters. We work hard for the betterment of our communities and enjoy the sisterhood across the nation. In reality, the Federal Government views us as a non-profit Corporation that must be run like any other Corporation in the United States. We must adhere to all rules and regulations mandated by the Government, to allow us to continue to function. Our Provinces are its subsidiaries and you, as members, are its stockholders. Our National Officers are the CEO, Counsel and Board of this Corporation and the Province Chairmen are the President of the subsidiaries. The officers of this corporation have reports and forms that are due to the Federal Government by specific dates, which keeps us in good standing with the Federal Government. They must compile reports and report back to the stockholders at annual meetings. Whether that be National or Province Convention, deadlines must be met.

Our National By-Laws and Province Standing Rules were established by our membership, through equal opportunity voting, to help establish deadlines that need to be met by all chapters. For example, Form 1 is due by 6/1 and Insurance Liability and Form 52 are due by 8/1. Some of these forms require a payment be sent and a Form 7 attached to clarify how the payment is to be recorded. Not only is it important for the Forms to be filed on time, but the payment needs to be received on time. This is not to make busy work for you and your chapter. It is to ensure that the necessary Officer has all the information needed to meet her deadline on time and to ensure that our Corporation runs smoothly and remains in "good standing".

I often hear and probably have said it myself, "I'll get around to it when I have the time. What are they going to do, fire me? I'm a volunteer!". Of course, we are not going to fire you, but that is the reason why we have to fine your chapter if you do not comply with the deadlines. Your tardiness may have caused a National Officer or Province Chairman undue stress and added work because they had to follow up with, and remind you that something that hadn't been done, needed to rush to complete a report, or had to file an addendum. Worse yet, not meeting a deadline can cause Delta Theta Tau to pay a fine.

So, if we all work together, and meet our "Deadlines", we will continue to look like the well-oiled and organized Sorority, with a **20/20 Perfect Vision, Clear Mission** that new prospective members are looking for.

# Delta Home Program Directorate

Bonnie has picked a great theme this year: 2020 Perfect Vision: Clear Mission. Your Delta Home Board has a very clear mission. We want to help our sisters.

As you watch the trees budding and flowers starting to bloom this spring, we want you to take a moment to view the requirements of Delta Home to see if you, or one of your sisters, might qualify for this monthly financial assistance program.

So, who qualifies for the Delta Home? She'll need to:

Be 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances)

Be a DTT member for at least 7 years

Have financial need greater than income

Have paid her Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 in lieu of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Terri Shannon, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 513-255-5043 or email her at <a href="mailto:shannot1@miamioh.edu">shannot1@miamioh.edu</a>. We take great care to make sure every applicant's and recipient's information remains confidential.

After we receive your application, we'll usually let you know if you are approved or not within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. We will usually pay one of your bills each month, such as your mortgage, insurance, car payment, or utilities, etc., depending on your financial need. The amount we can provide is based on Delta Home Standing Rules.

Keep in mind that the most common reason a sister is denied is because she is receiving Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home can no longer help her financially.

This program exists to help Delta Theta Tau members. If you are having trouble paying your bills each month, please ask Terri for an application. If you see a sister in need, please speak up and let them know about the program. We accept and review new applications year round—so don't delay.

The National Philanthropy Committee met on Saturday, January 18, 2020 via telephone conference. Those in attendance were committee members, Jeanie Claggett - Chairman, Ryan Parsons-Rozycki - Secretary, Brenda Moore - Third Member, Mary Beth Godsey - National Secretary of Philanthropy and Bonnie Wells -National President.

There were two Scholarship Grant applications that the committee reviewed. Fortunately, each of the application packets that were received were complete and arrive by the postmarked deadline, therefore scholarship grants were awarded this year. Both recipients are students attending Purdue University Northwest in Hammond, Indiana.

The National Philanthropy Committee is working together to identify new and innovative ways of marketing the Scholarship Grant to increase visibility. As always, there will be a Publicity Release handed out at the 2020 National Convention again this year. We ask that you please give this release to your local newspaper, local college or university so that this information can get to as many students as possible who are working towards their master's degree in Counseling. **We would like to thank all the chapters for sharing this important information about our scholarships each year.** 

There were four 501C-3 National Yearly Philanthropy Projects submitted for consideration and it was determined that all criteria were met. The committee recommended that these projects be presented to the delegation at National Convention for a vote.

At the 1997 National Convention in Orlando, Florida a new national project, NFED, was adopted by the general assembly. Once again, Delta Theta Tau is proud to be able to continue supporting this wonderful national project. At the 2017 National Convention, the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of selecting **this as our project**, the delegation overwhelmingly voted to donate \$5,000.00 to NFED **each year**. Can't wait to hear about all the new research that is going on and how successful it is becoming.

Jeanie Claggett, Chairman of the Philanthropy Committee took on a huge task of updating the duties of each member on the committee. She has clarified directions and several forms. Thank you for your hard work and including the other members in this task.

Don't forget the Grant Application has been updated and is on the website along with the National Yearly Project information. Don't you just love our website?

The Philanthropy committee will have a table set-up with a Bulletin Board at the National Convention. At this table we will be collecting "Used Glasses" for VP – recycling for re-use. #### **CONVENTION RULES 2020**

- 1. Credential badges shall be worn at all convention meetings.
- 2. Members of the convention shall be in their seats five minutes before each meeting.
- 3. The Sergeant-At-Arms will not admit anyone during roll call and Sorority Ceremonies.
- 4. A voting member who finds it necessary to leave a business meeting must leave her credentials badge with the Sergeant-At-Arms to be returned when she returns to the meeting.
- 5. The National President may change the order of business when deemed necessary.
- 6. Main motions and amendments shall be written on a motion form, signed by the mover, and given to the National President, Parliamentarian, and the National Secretary for the minutes.
- 7. Debate shall be alternated between those wishing to speak in favor of a motion and those wishing to speak against it.
- 8. A voting member wishing the floor shall rise, go to the microphone and address the Chair. After being recognized, give her name, chapter name and city.
- 9. A voting member of the convention may speak only twice on the same question unless given consent by the assembly. She may not speak the second time if someone who has not spoken wishes the floor.
- 10. If a non-voting member wishes to speak, she shall ask permission of the Chair and if there is no objection from the assembly, she may speak.
- 11. Debate shall be limited to three (3) minutes for each speaker. The Board of Trustees shall serve as timekeepers.
- 12. All votes during the convention meeting shall be taken by a voting card unless a revote is necessary.
- 13. Photography is not permitted during Sorority Ceremonies.
- 14. Food is not permitted in meetings or workshops.
- 15. Business wear only in the convention meeting room; this is defined as business dress, skirt, slacks and capris. No jeans, shorts, or T-shirts are allowed. Exception: DTT t-shirts will be allowed at the Friday morning business meeting and Sunday Installation.
