

Perfect Vision Voluntary Project

VSP Eyes of Hope is working together with Doctors of Optometry, community and charitable partners, and public officials to increase access to eye care and eyewear where it is needed most. During recent catastrophes Eyes of Hope partnered with other non-profit aid groups to provide eyewear and exams to survivors.

After **Hurricane Harvey** they helped 750 teachers and educators who were among those who lost everything, Care was supplied by local doctors, all of whom had practices destroyed or damaged.

After **Hurricane Maria** nearly 200 pediatric patients, their families and the hospital staff received eye care and eyewear. Of those patients who received exams, nearly 70% needed prescription glasses.

Following the **Camp Fire**, a VSP Eyes of Hope mobile clinic was stationed in Chico for two weeks to care for those who were affected by the wildfire and support local VSP network doctors whose practices were damaged. In total, nearly 900 people received access to eye exams and replacement glasses.

As of 2018, Eyes of Hope has provided access to free eye care and eyewear globally for more than 2.5 million in need, including 119,000 people affected by disasters in the US.

There is absolutely <u>no cost to the Sorority</u> to do this special project. Eyes of Hope will supply boxes and mailers to send the glasses to them. AND, for our members who would like to participate - **EYEGLASSES WEIGH NEXT TO NOTHING IN YOUR SUITCASE**.

Boxes will be set up in the back of the meeting room for any donations of eyewear, prescription eyeglasses, frames only, or even sunglasses.

Some of you may be putting off making suggestions in your chapter thinking this isn't a good time. You may have a desire to get more involved but feel it isn't the right time. There could be someone in your chapter that desires becoming a National Officer and puts it on the back burner so to speak. Delta Home Program Directorate

Bonnie has picked a great theme this year: 2020 Perfect Vision: Clear Mission. Your Delta Home Board has a mission possible. Cue the soundtrack. Your mission, Delts, should you choose to accept it, is to help your sisters!

When we all work together as a team, we make extraordinary things happen—maybe some things you thought were impossible. With everything going on with COVID-19 this year, I'm sure some of you have seen your financial situation change. Please take a moment to review the requirements of Delta Home to see if you, or one of your sisters, might qualify for this monthly financial assistance program.

So, who qualifies for the Delta Home? She'll need to:

Be 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances)

Be a DTT member for at least 7 years

Have financial need greater than income

Have paid her Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 in lieu of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Terri Shannon, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 513-255-5043 or email her at shannot1@miamioh.edu. We take great care to make sure every applicant's and recipient's information remains confidential.

After we receive your application, we'll usually let you know if you are approved or not within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. We will usually pay one of your bills each month, such as your mortgage, insurance, car payment, or utilities, etc., depending on your financial need. The amount we can provide is based on Delta Home Standing Rules.

Keep in mind that the most common reason a sister is denied is that she is receiving Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home can no longer help her financially.

Our mission is to help our Delta Theta Tau members. Please ask Terri for an application if you need help and meet the qualifications above. And, if you see a sister in need, please speak up and let them know about the program. We accept and review new applications year-round—so don't delay. Please stay healthy!

Delta Sisters, I can't tell you how excited I am that after several years of planning we will be together soon at our 2020 National Convention! The Hostess Chapters have been working hard to make sure that we all have a good time at "The Roaring 20's – Delta Style" Convention. It will be our pleasure to host you at the beautiful Hilton Chicago/Oak Brook Hills Resort July 8-12.

As the days wind down until convention, below is information to note in your planning:

Registration: Registration forms were in the spring issue of GRIT, in this summer issue, on our DTT website, and mailed to each chapter. Deadlines are **June 8**th for Delegates, and **June 23**rd for Non-Delegates and Non-Members. Registration will be from 3:00-7:00 Wednesday, and each day of convention.

<u>Transportation:</u> The Resort is approximately 18 miles from both Chicago O'Hare and Midway Airports. Airport shuttles, taxis, or Uber can get you to the Resort. The resort shuttle can get you around at no charge within a 5 mile radius of the Resort. The train station is 1 mile from the Resort which can take you to downtown Chicago.

Resort: The Hilton Chicago/Oak Brook Hills Resort & Convention Center is located at 3500 Midwest Road, Oak Brook IL, just west of downtown Chicago. It sits on 150 acres and features the Willow Crest Golf Club on its premises. It has an outdoor and indoor pool, and offers every feature of a resort. Each room has a refrigerator and free internet. Reservations can be made by calling toll free at 800-774-1500 or 630-850-5555 (mention Delta Theta Tau) or hyperlink Delta Theta Tau National Convention. Reservations must be made by June 13th in order to receive the convention rate of \$129.00 plus 11% tax.

Parking: Parking is complimentary at the Resort.

Restaurants: The Resort offers several different options to eat. The B Restaurant is off the hotel lobby and open all day and features a wood fire oven for pizzas. CONVENTION RULES 2020

- 1. Credential badges shall be worn at all convention meetings.
- 2. Members of the convention shall be in their seats five minutes before each meeting.
- 3. The Sergeant-At-Arms will not admit anyone during roll call and Sorority Ceremonies.
- 4. A voting member who finds it necessary to leave a business meeting must leave her credentials badge with the Sergeant-At-Arms to be returned when she returns to the meeting.
- 5. The National President may change the order of business when deemed necessary.
- 6. Main motions and amendments shall be written on a motion form, signed by the mover, and given to the National President, Parliamentarian, and the National Secretary for the minutes.
- 7. Debate shall be alternated between those wishing to speak in favor of a motion and those wishing to speak against it.
- 8. A voting member wishing the floor shall rise, go to the microphone and address the Chair. After being recognized, give her name, chapter name and city.
- 9. A voting member of the convention may speak only twice on the same question unless given consent by the assembly. She may not speak the second time if someone who has not spoken wishes the floor.
- 10. If a non-voting member wishes to speak, she shall ask permission of the Chair and if there is no objection from the assembly, she may speak.
- 11. Debate shall be limited to three (3) minutes for each speaker. The Board of Trustees shall serve as timekeepers.
- 12. All votes during the convention meeting shall be taken by a voting card unless a revote is necessary.
- 13. Photography is not permitted during Sorority Ceremonies.
- 14. Food is not permitted in meetings or workshops.
- 15. Business wear only in the convention meeting room; this is defined as business dress, skirt, slacks and capris. No jeans, shorts, or T-shirts are allowed. Exception: DTT t-shirts will be allowed at the Friday morning business meeting and Sunday Installation.
