GRIV Clarification

How do we pay for GRIT? When is it due?

There is a lot of confusion over how much to pay for GRIT if not affiliating for the entire year. This is understandable the way the legislation passed a few years ago. The current legislation, National Bylaws, Article X, National Obligations of Chapters, Section 1, b, lists GRIT as \$15 per year/\$5 per issue.

After clarification from Pat Koch, Parliamentarian, the breakdown is: \$15 per year/4 issues. If affiliating after September 10, pay for 3 issues at \$5 per issue = \$15. If affiliating after December 10, pay for 2 issues at \$5 per issue = \$10. If affiliating between March 10 and April 30, pay for 1 issue at \$5.

The fiscal year for GRIT issues is Autumn, Winter, Spring, and Summer. Please note these dates in your files, so your chapter will know how much to pay for a new member. If you ever have any questions, please contact Executive Secretary, Beth Wallis or Editor of GRIT, Doris Sanders. **Now let's go out and find those new members!**

Greetings all!

I sit here this morning contemplating the postponement of our 2020 Province Conventions. The last convention would have been this past weekend here in Stockton. Mu Lambda was hosting for the first time since the loss of our past convention chairman, Lynn Ellen Hahn, three years ago. In fact, Facebook showed a picture of our Province Chairman, and other wonderful Delta sisters on Lynn Ellen's boat the afternoon after our convention six years ago. In that time, we have suffered the loss of some wonderful sisters all over our provinces. I have missed the opportunity to memorialize these sisters in a significant way. I am also reminded that these amazing women

had the GRIT and the gumption to bring us this far and we can continue to share the joys and celebrations today no matter what challenges lie ahead!

With that in mind, it is important for all Province Chairmen to complete the tasks before them with reports turned in to Assigned Officers and to stay in touch with each other all year. GRIT helps with the celebrations and sharing. We also have many ways to contact each other that are cost effective and timely.

I surprised myself this morning when I received a telephone call from AARP. I recently decided to join this organization. Today they hosted a teleconference on scams. I decided to stay on the line and learn what they might share while multi-tasking cleaning in the kitchen and wondered if they might mention the latest in scams. If you are home these days your phone probably rings off the hook, but NOT from calls you enjoy. Scammers are constant it seems. Today I learned why they are so constant. In 2018 and 2019, imposter scams received 121 MILLION dollars from victims and the Social Security scam received at least 38 million! No wonder they keep trying. The best things you can do is #1 – screen your calls, and #2 – hang up! The latest scam is on credit cards where they tell you someone bought a computer but is sending it to a different address from yours. So, if you just confirm the credit card number, they can cancel it and send you a new card. I have received this call at least five times in the past three weeks. One woman even mentioned that some of the latest scam calls are using her own phone number. If you do not recognize the name or number on the caller ID, do not answer. If someone really wants to speak to you, they will leave a message. Never give personal information over the phone unless you are the one who made the initial contact. Do not ever wire money or purchase gift cards and give numbers over the phone to someone. So, that is the end of my public service announcement!

This has been a difficult year for many. As a bona fide introvert, I have not suffered as much as others. I feel that I am being a good citizen by staying home and staying safe and not requiring health care beyond my normal health care. There has been gardening, cleaning the garage, organizing a craft room, and many other things to occupy my time. Extroverts have a much harder challenge this year. If you like making phone calls, you can sign up with a senior center and contact seniors who might be lonely. AARP also said they have a program for this contact. Just because we may be limiting our contacts, does not mean we ignore one another.

Delta Theta Tau still has a mission this strange year of 2020 and that is to "Sew Seeds of Friendship" into 2021. So, take care of yourselves, wear a mask, wash your hands, limit your contacts and stay healthy! We want to see you as soon as possible.

By the time you read this article, presidents from all chapters and alumnae associations should have received a phone call or zoom meeting with one of the National Officers. This "reach out" was National's opportunity to connect, and check the well being of each of our chapters and alumnae associations. We discussed issues, offered advice and brought problems to the attention of all the National Officers. I hope that everyone enjoyed the experience. I know I did. This gave me the opportunity to speak to many sisters that I may never had the opportunity to do so otherwise.

Communication is the key to success. Under the current situation we are all living in, communication within your chapter, your province and with

National Officers is very important. Please keep in mind that safety is our first priority. If chapter members are not comfortable meeting in person, especially since colder temperatures may force meetings indoors, today's technology does allow us to have zoom meetings and phone conferences. In my own chapter, we have some members who prefer to meet in person and some who have underlining condition that makes in person meetings impossible. We offer both in person and zoom meetings so all can attend. Each member must be kept informed and have a voice in the decisions made for the good of the chapter and Delta Theta Tau. If a member is left out, they will eventually lose interest and drop. If you as Member, Officer of the Chapter, or Province Chairman have a problem, please reach out to a National Officer. We cannot help if we are unaware there is an issue.

I went searching for how Delta Theta Tau Sorority handled the Spanish Flu Pandemic from 1918 through 1920. Even though "The Golden Years" and "Diamond Years" never really mentions the Pandemic, it is very apparent that communication and camaraderie kept those "Delts" moving forward. 1906 was the first National Convention with 21 Deltas attending. At the 1912 convention, the suggestion of a "Round Robin" letter was made. Alpha chapter was to start it, and each chapter was to keep it one week and forward it on. If they neglected to send it on, they were charged one dollar for every week it was delayed. I know you will all be "thrilled to know," it is believed that was the beginning of the first fine and penalties. Since one chapter was accessed fifteen dollars which was later relieved of the penalty. (Okay, I found it funny. I hope you do too.) In the Spring of 1917, the first issue of "Grit" was published. Even though Delta Theta Tau was founded more as a social group in 1903, it was kept alive by communication, and National Conventions which included an evening of dance.

Just like this past year when we were forced to cancel National and Province Conventions, history repeats itself. National Conventions were cancelled during both WWI and WWII. But Delta Theta Tau survived, and most cases thrived, and they even increased the number of chapters during those time. Communication kept us together, and communication was much more difficult during those previous years, but we survived. No internet meant no emails or Zoom meetings for them. Even the telephone system wasn't like what we have today.

As it is today, Delta Theta Tau had their ups and downs. Add a chapter and lose a chapter, and between 1917 and 1919, it was referred to as "The jinx of only thirteen chapters," which held for a total of three National Conventions. By the 1920 National Convention, Delta Theta Tau had 17 chapters. "The jinx of thirteen" was broken. After the end of WWII, in July of 1946, Delta's literally poured into the city of Indianapolis, for a record-breaking 38th National Convention. There were "too many Deltas" and they were housed in five hotels. By this time, 145 chapters and 56 alumnae associations with Delta Theta Tau totaling a membership of 9,285 existed. Maybe we can have the same type of results by the end of the current Coronavirus Pandemic. Communication is the key.

Hi sisters! As I was reading Julie Swoveland's article in the Autumn Grit, I started thinking about the "quilt" of

friendships I have made through Delta Theta Tau Sorority. For me, it started small, just the sisters in my chapter. Then I went to a Province Convention, and it grew a bit more. Then it exploded at my first national convention in Indianapolis. What a blast! Since then, new Delta friends have been added to my quilt every year—except this year.

And what a year it has been! It's been hard on everyone. It's been more difficult to make new friends when events get canceled and everyone is wearing a mask in public. However, all of us can nurture the friendships we already have a bit better. Call a sister! Send an email or text. See how they're doing. If you come across a sister 60 or over who is in financial trouble, remind her about Delta Home.

How about you? Maybe your kids have been helping you financially, but they can't now. Has your financial situation changed during the pandemic? Could you use a bit of help?

So, who qualifies for help from the Delta Home? She'll need to:

Be 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances)

Be a DTT member for at least 7 years

Have financial need greater than income

Have paid her Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 in lieu of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Terri Shannon, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 513-255-5043 or email her at shannot1@miamioh.edu. We take great care to make sure every applicant's and recipient's information remains confidential.

After receiving your application, we'll let you know if you are approved or not within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. We will usually pay one of your bills each month, such as your mortgage, insurance, car payment, or utilities, etc., depending on your financial need. The amount we can provide is based on Delta Home Standing Rules.

Keep in mind that the most common reason a sister is denied is that she is receiving Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home can no longer help her financially.

Keep connecting with all of the pieces in your own very special DTT quilt—each one is priceless—we are in this together!

HAS YOUR FINANCIAL STATUS CHANGED DUE TO THE PANDEMIC??

Norma Money was initiated into Zeta Lambda, Shelbyville, IN on May 18, 1943. Not only did she serve our sorority at the chapter level, but she also served as a National Officer. Norma held these National Offices:



1954-1955 National Treasurer 1957-1958 3rd Member, Board of Trustees 1958-1959 Secretary, Board of Trustees 1959-1960 Chairman, Board of Trustees 1960-1961 National Vice President 1961-1962 National President

Norma was a Delta for 19 years and it is noted she had exceptional talents when speaking and writing to her Delta sisters. She used the words charity and philanthropy as the objects of the sorority, and explained, "Philanthropy is the spirit of active good toward one's fellowmen, and charity is benevolence, especially manifested in provision for the relief of the poor." "We must have love in our big family of sisters. We must help, protect, encourage and love one another always.

When Norma was elected National President in 1961, she closed her acceptance speech with these words. "As we face another year in Delta Theta Tau, we know not what the future holds, but who holds the

future." Then she lighted three candles - one for the past, one for the present, and the third as a symbol of the future, saying, "The thought I want to leave with you is that the glow of a candle, even a tiny candle, can change your immediate surroundings from darkness to light. It can light up a room and give light to others". She wanted all Deltas to be a candle and a beacon to others by letting their light shine so others may see the love in their heart and charity for others. Norma had a way with words and was an inspiration to new officers.

Norma closed her convention with these words, "May each and every sister in our sorority continue to live her life, according to the teaching of our sorority. May each exert her influence for the good of mankind, ever being alert to the forces that would destroy our effectiveness."

In 1970 Norma was the Convention Coordinator of National Convention held in Atlanta, GA. The theme was

"Peachtree Plantation." In 1969 while promoting the National Convention at Province Conventions she appeared in a red bathing suit as "Miss Atlanta". "Don't You Dare Miss Atlanta" and on the opening day of National Convention she addressed the convention in that same swimsuit prior to opening ceremonies.

Unfortunately, Norma knew she had a terminal illness at that convention and rested whenever she could, still providing all attendees with a marvelous experience at convention. Norma became a new bloom beyond the wall on April 28, 1971.

Many chapters donated money to pay for Norma's medical expenses and at the 1971 convention held in Las Vegas there was \$12,283.60 left in the fund. With these funds, the convention voted to establish the Norma Money Fund to pay medical expenses for any member in need.

The Norma Money fund was beginning to run low and The National Benefit Fund wasn't being used. At the 2007 National Convention there was legislation to combine the two funds and call it the **Norma Money Benefit Fund** to be kept in reserve for eligible members who are in dire need, or in need of financial aid for medical care.

National Nominating Committee

November 20, 2020

Dear Delta Sisters:

Enclosed is the Official Nominating Form. If your chapter wishes to present a Nominee for a National Office-President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Secretary of Philanthropy, Third Member, Board of Trustees, (this year must come from the general membership), and National Nominating Committee, this form must be filled out and signed by the Chapter President, Chapter Recording Secretary, and the Candidate. The Form must be returned by March 1, 2021, to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee. Only one person from a chapter may be nominated for office.

In accordance with the National Bylaws, publicity on all candidates shall be limited to submitting their qualifications to the Nominating Committee on the Official Nominating Form, to be published in the preconvention (Winter) issue of GRIT.

Perhaps there is some capable member in your chapter that would like to be nominated but she has never been asked and she hesitates to suggest it herself. Look around - do you have someone with the qualifications and time? Qualifications as stated in the National Bylaws, Article XV, Section 1:

Who has been continuously active for at least two (2) years immediately prior to nomination Who has served as President, Secretary or Treasurer of a chapter for at least one (1) year Who has sufficient training, time and qualifications. Nominees for Treasurer shall have a working knowledge of QuickBooks or a current financial records program.

Who is not currently serving as Province Chairman.

Only those members who have served a minimum of one (1) year on the National Council and have completed the three (3) year term on the Board of Trustees shall be eligible for the office of President or Vice-President.

Due to the volume of correspondence entailed, a nominee should be able to type and have a computer and email at her disposal. Each National Officer has her respective duties to be fulfilled, and an officer must be able to devote a few hours each day or a few days each week to handle her responsibilities. Each officer is expected to make at least five (5) to eight (8) chapter visits during her tenure as a National Officer, serve as assigned officer for a Province Convention, attend Midyear Meeting in February and pre and post convention meetings in conjunction with National Convention each year. Attending other Province Conventions (other than one assigned) and completing visitations not approved by the Chairman, Board of Trustees and National President are at own expense. A nominee must have internet access and use Microsoft Word for e-mailing sorority correspondence.

The Nominating Committee receives the nominations, prepares them for publication in GRIT, and presents the nominations during National Convention. We feel there are many members in our sorority who are capable and well qualified and who have the time necessary to be a National Officer. We would like to have at least two (2) or more nominees for each office this year and have their qualifications published for the consideration of the chapters.

Teresa McAllister Outstanding Service Award

Teresa McAllister was initiated into Delta Theta Tau in 1948 into Eta Chi, Cayuga, Indiana. Teresa was an Editor and Publisher of her own newspaper after she retired from the U.S. Postal Department. Teresa was a popular speaker and talked to many community groups. Always reaching out to many in their time of need. If you needed help, Teresa was there.

At the Denver, Colorado Convention in 1964 at post -convention, Teresa McAllister was appointed Editor of GRIT where she served for 29 years. She stated that day to Council and Board that GRIT was a vital communication among the members, which is the most essential part of Delta Theta Tau. It was her goal to edit it to the best of her ability. Later she was the writer and photographer of the "Diamond Years", a 75 history of Delta Theta Tau.

Teresa loved Delta Theta Tau. Sorority was a big part of her life and consumed a big place in her heart. Every member was important to her. When she met you, she remembered your name and probably your chapter. She enjoyed National and Province Conventions. On Wednesday at National Convention, she would always be in the lobby to greet members as they arrived.

In 1978 at the National Convention, Teresa was awarded an Honorary Membership. The resolution was read, and this was her response "I'm sorry, I cannot accept this, it doesn't belong to me. It may be my name, this title of Honorary Membership and it is certainly an honor. I



thank you, although I think there are many, many more of you sitting down there who deserve it more than I. So on behalf of you, I accept it for you."

In 1979, 6000 copies of GRIT were printed, The Diamond Years was completed, and Teresa was the Mystery Speaker at the celebration for 75 years of Delta Theta Tau at the Banquet. In her retirement issue of GRIT she stated, "Like a bricklayer who hoped not only to build just a building, but a beautiful cathedral, I hope and I think I have built copies of GRIT that enriched the heritage of Delta Theta Tau. Together we have built and continue to build a magnificent monument of philanthropy, the foundation our Founders gave us."

Many Delta have beautiful memories of Teresa McAllister who was called home on May 30, 1997.

At the 1998 National Convention, the "Teresa McAllister Outstanding Service Awards" was presented and unanimously approved. It is presently awarded to a member in recognition of her Outstanding Service to Delta Theta Tau. Recipients are nominated by their chapter or individual and submitted to the National Officers, voted on, then presented at National Convention. It is a tremendous honor to receive this award of recognition.
