Perfect Vision Voluntary Project

Since the 2020 **National Convention** was canceled last year, we did not have an opportunity to do the VSP Eyes of Hope that Bonnie Wells, PNP, had presented in the Spring 2020 issue of GRIT. I would like to carry this over to this year's **National Convention**. When Bonnie was installed as President, she had an idea to pursue a philanthropy project for **National Convention** that would not cost anyone any money and will garner us some press. After searching several options, she found VSP Eyes of Hope. This is similar to the Lions Club eyeglass collection project. Eyes of Hope provides collection boxes at **convention** for free, with postage. All we need to do is clean out our drawers at home and bring old eyeglasses and even sunglasses to **convention** to drop into the boxes at the Philanthropy Committee Publicity Board.

VSP Eyes of Hope is working together with Doctors of Optometry, community and charitable partners, and public officials to increase access to eye care and eyewear where it is needed most. During recent catastrophes Eyes of Hope partnered with other non-profit aid groups to provide eyewear and exams to survivors.

After **Hurricane Harvey** they helped 750 teachers and educators who were among those who lost everything, Care was supplied by local doctors, all of whom had practices destroyed or damaged.

After **Hurricane Maria** nearly 200 pediatric patients, their families and the hospital staff received eye care and eyewear. Of those patients who received exams, nearly 70% needed prescription glasses.

Following the **Camp Fire**, a VSP Eyes of Hope mobile clinic was stationed in Chico for two weeks to care for those who were affected by the wildfire and support local VSP network doctors whose practices were damaged. In total, nearly 900 people received access to eye exams and replacement glasses.

As of 2018, Eyes of Hope has provided access to free eye care and eyewear globally for more than 2.5 million in need, including 119,000 people affected by disasters in the US.

There is absolutely <u>no cost to the Sorority</u> to do this special project. Eyes of Hope will supply boxes and mailers to send the glasses to them. AND, for our members who would like to participate - **EYEGLASSES WEIGH NEXT TO NOTHING IN YOUR SUITCASE**.

Boxes will be set up in the back of the meeting room for any donations of eyewear, prescription eyeglasses, frames only, or even sunglasses.



We accept complete sets of prescription glasses or readers with plastic or metal frames and intact lenses.

Please note that we can't accept lenses without a frame, broken or damaged eyewear, eyewear cases, or contact lenses.

Please bring your spare glasses to National Convention to help provide vision for those in need

It's hard to believe that when this issue arrives at your house, we will be making the final preparations for National Convention in Columbus. I can't wait! It has been an exhausting year of waiting and hoping. We lost some very special sisters along the way. The memorial service will be extra hard on so many of us. Ah, but the joy we will feel when we are back together again will be sweet.

With everything going on with COVID-19 this year, I want to remind you to take a quick look at your finances. Have you seen your financial situation change? Please take a moment to review the

requirements of Delta Home to see if you, or one of your sisters, might qualify for this monthly financial assistance program.

So, who qualifies for the Delta Home? She'll need to:

Be 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances)

Be a DTT member for at least 7 years

Have financial need greater than income

Have paid her Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 in lieu of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Terri Shannon, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 513-255-5043 or email her at shannot1@miamioh.edu. We take great care to make sure every applicant's and recipient's information remains confidential.

After we receive your application, we'll usually let you know if you are approved or not within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. We will usually pay one of your bills each month, such as your mortgage, insurance, car payment, or utilities, etc., depending on your financial need. The amount we can provide is based on Delta Home Standing Rules.

Keep in mind that the most common reason a sister is denied is that she is receiving Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home can no longer help her financially.

Our mission is to help our Delta Theta Tau members. Please ask Terri for an application if you need help and meet the qualifications above. And, if you see a sister in need, please speak up and let them know about the program. We accept

and review new applications year-round—so don't delay.

I do want to send a huge shout out to Debbie Funk for the great article in the spring issue of GRIT, "History of the Delta Theta Tau Memorial Home" and how the Delta Home Program came into existence. Check it out if you missed it!

CONVENTION RULES 2021

- 1. State and Federal COVID guidelines will be followed.
- 2. Credential badges shall be worn at all convention meetings.
- 3. Members of the convention shall be in their seats five minutes before each meeting.
- 4. The Sergeant-At-Arms will not admit anyone during roll call and Sorority Ceremonies.
- 5. A voting member, who finds it necessary to leave a business meeting must leave her credentials badge with the Sergeant-At-Arms, to be returned when she returns to the meeting.
- 6. The National President may change the order of business when deemed necessary.
- 7. Main motions and amendments shall be written on a motion form, signed by the mover, and given to the National President, Parliamentarian and the National Secretary for the minutes.
- 8. Debate shall be alternated between those wishing to speak in favor of a motion and those wishing to speak against it.
- 9. A voting member wishing the floor shall rise, go to the microphone and address the Chair. After being recognized, give her name, chapter name and city.
- 10. A voting member of the convention may speak only twice on the same question unless given consent by the assembly. She may not speak the second time if someone who has not spoken wishes the floor.
- 11. If a non-voting member wishes to speak, she shall ask permission of the Chair and if there is no objection from the assembly, she may speak.
- 12. Debate shall be limited to three (3) minutes for each speaker. The Board of Trustees shall serve as time keepers.
- 13. All votes during the convention meeting shall be taken by a voting card unless a revote is necessary.
- 14. Photography is not permitted during the Sorority Ceremonies.
- 15. Food is not permitted in meetings or workshops.
- 16. Business wear only in the convention meeting room; this is defined as business dress, skirt, slacks and capris. No jeans, shorts, or T-shirts are allowed. Exception: DTT t-shirts will be allowed at the Friday morning business meeting and Sunday Installation.
- 17. During all business meetings, workshops, and committee meetings, all electronic devices and cellular phones will be turned off or placed on a silent/vibrating mode and must be put away (not to be on the table). Use is allowed during breaks only.
- 18. Pages are available to distribute all notes, messages and any other information.
- 19. Sales, including approved suppliers, are permitted only in the designated areas.
- 20. Voting members shall pay a fine to the National Secretary immediately following the close of each meeting for each:
 - -\$1.00 for arriving late to any meeting.
 - -\$5.00 for failure to vote at National Election.
 - -\$5.00 for failure to attend any business meeting or workshop(s) unless excused by National Council and Board of Trustees.
 - -\$5.00 for failure to attend the model initiation and/or the installation of officers, unless written excuse is approved by the Presiding Officer.
