Eleven (11) individuals are presently receiving assistance. Two (2) of these are Special Gift Fund Only recipients. Sadly, we lost three recipients this past year.

They reside in Arizona, California, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Nevada, Oregon.

Total benefits of \$55,777.60 were paid in 2020-21 from the Delta Home Fund. Since the start of the program in 1972, \$3,266,322.00 in benefits has been paid.

Gifts disbursed from the Special Gift Fund totaled \$1,120.00 in 2020-2021. This fund is used for birthday and Christmas presents, chapter and alumnae dues, GRIT subscriptions, National and Province Convention registrations along with unexpected expenses. Donations to the Special Gift Fund are needed so we can continue the level of giving to our recipients that we have done in the past. We have had many donations this past year. Thank you for your continued support.

The Directorate held its annual meeting virtually due to COVID-19 and financial updates were reviewed and the business of the program was completed.

The investments for 2020-2021 were managed by Cadinha Conservative Asset Allocation, Honolulu, HI, NWQ Investment Management Co., Los Angeles, CA, and Jackson Annuities and Insurance. Morgan Stanley Consulting Group, Indianapolis, IN holds the securities.

2020-2021 ANNUAL REPORT OF NATIONAL PHILANTHROPY COMMITTEE

The Annual Meeting of the National Philanthropy Committee was held via video conference on Saturday January 9, 2021. Those in attendance were Ryan Parsons-Rozycki, Chairman; Brenda Moore, Secretary; Linda Dressen, Third Member; Mary Beth Godsey, National Secretary of Philanthropy; and Julie Swoveland, National President.

The purpose of the meeting was as follows:

- 1. Award Grants for 2021-2022 to graduate level students in the Field of Counseling.
- 2. Review new National Philanthropy Project submissions and make recommendations for awards.
- 3. Review and update forms, policies and procedures in the handbooks of the National Philanthropy Committee and the National Officers.

As a National Philanthropy Project since 1997, the National Foundation of Ectodermal Dysplasia has received \$241,634.53 from National and local Delta Chapters. The Committee thanks everyone for this continued support of NFED.

The total money available for the National Philanthropy Project is \$6,700.38, however no chapter submitted a project for consideration. Therefore, the National Philanthropy Committee decided to award \$6,700.38 to the National Foundation of Ectodermal Dysplasia.
