The Chair welcomed delegates and non-delegates who were attending their first Province Convention by having them stand.

The Minutes of the 2019 Alpha Province Convention were approved by the Assigned Officer. There was no request to read the minutes aloud.

Bev Austin, Standing Rules Committee, read the convention rules.

- Credential badges shall be worn at all convention meetings.
- Members of the Convention shall be in their seats at least five (5) minutes before each meeting.
- The Sergeant-At-Arms will be instructed not to admit anyone during roll call.

- A fine of one dollar (\$1.00) shall be assessed each Delegate not in her seat and answering roll call at each meeting, or leaving before adjourned, unless excused by the presiding officer. Payment of a fine shall be made to the Convention Secretary immediately following the close of the meeting. The Sergeant-at-Arms will be instructed not to admit anyone during roll call.
- The Province Chairman may change the order of business when deemed necessary.
- Workshops are considered a meeting of the Province Convention.
- A Delegate addressing the Chair shall stand and, after being recognized, give her name, chapter, and city.
- Main motions shall be written, signed by the maker of the motion, and given to the Convention Secretary for the minutes.
- Debate shall be limited to five (5) minutes for each speaker. The Province Chairman to designate who shall serve as time keepers, preferably the Tellers of this Convention.
- A voting member of the Convention may speak only twice on the same question unless given consent by the assembly. She may not speak the second time if someone who has not spoken wishes the floor.
- When a two-thirds (2/3) vote is required, it may be taken by standing without counting, unless there is a question as to the vote. In this case, it will be a standing count-off vote.
- A delegate who finds it necessary to leave a business meeting must leave her credentials badge with the Sergeant-At-Arms. When the member returns to the meeting, the Sergeant-At-Arms will return her credentials badge.
- Pages shall pass all messages during the meetings.
- Pantsuits are acceptable apparel for the Convention meetings (this does not include shorts or like apparel).
- There shall be no smoking in the meeting room.
- If a Non-Delegate wishes to speak, she asks permission of the Chair and if the assembly does not object, she may speak.

- So that all may enjoy the Convention, Delegates and visitors are requested to refrain from whispering.
- During all business meetings, workshops, committee meetings and functions, pagers and cellular phones shall be turned off or put on the silent vibrate mode.
- Members of the convention shall refrain from texting during the business meeting.

Convention Rules are adopted as read.

The Chair presented the Pre-Financial report of the Province. (See Attachment #1)

The Chair recognized Pat Mote, Alpha PEG to give a report regarding Expansion & Growth. Pat shared numbers specific to chapter growth and comparing philanthropy dollars and volunteer hours from 2018 to present. Even though our philanthropy efforts brought in less money, we still raised over \$600K in philanthropy and volunteers over 100,000 hours. The past two years forced chapters to use zoom, while other chapters suspended meetings. Some used social media for fundraising. We made lemonade out of lemons! Chapters shared with Pat why new members joined, how they invited new members, and also how communication works within Chapters. Pat has a private facebook group that her chapter uses to communicate with each other. Also the National Website is a great resource for forms, event calendar, etc.

Delta Xi, Alexandria—approached at our events. Community dinner.

Eta Lambda, Noblesville—volunteer hours. Recyclables. plastic tabs can be melted down into benches. It is done in Ft. Wayne. HS class washes them, counts them, and then takes a field trip to Ft Wayne. Receives them from long term care facilities. pop tabs are saved for the ronald mcdonald house.

Bev Austin-nothing to report

Philanthropic Projects: Reporting Member, Kelsey Stiner introduces the three projects:

Team of Mercy—nominated by Alpha Omicron – Terre Haute, Presented by Mandy Allen

Mandy Allen shared Executive Director is a member of their chapter, Christina Crist. Became involved after she lost her daughter to suicide. They serve the entire Wabash Valley by offering financial support, clean up. They have helped over 70 families this year

and never turn anyone away. Their budget this year was \$5K and they have already spent \$10K. If we choose them they will spend 100% towards counseling services.

PAWS—nominated by Lambda – Union City, Presented by Pat Mote

Pets Are Worth Saving is a non-profit in Union City that opened in 2013. Their goal is to rehome lost animals. Delta Sister, Linda Wood is a board member.

Homers Helpers— nominated by Delta Xi – Alexandria, Presented by Stephanie Ellis

Homers Helpers is a new non-profit recently formed in Alexandria after a dog who roamed was caught with the hopes to provide him a home and medical care. Unfortunately, his health was too bad and he had to be put to sleep but this influenced a group of people to create a service to the Alexandria community to assist with lost pets, pet food, and vaccination drives.

Quorum established for Alpha province. A vote was taken to be read in the afternoon meeting.

Meeting recessed for lunch.

The meeting was called to order by the Alpha Province Chair, Lindsey Cuneo, at 1:30 pm.

The Chair presented the National officers to perform a skit regarding receipts and form 52s—organize receipts by project, attached to an amount attached to the form 52, make copies of receipts so that they don't fade too much, and make it easier on everyone! Those receipts pass through a lot of fingers. Also discusses was the application for health services, Norma Money benefit fund. If a member needs medical care, they can submit it and receive up to \$1500.

National Vice President, Julie Callis shared that 20 Indiana chapters can have sales tax exemptions. By Oct 15 of every year, have to file to be sales tax exempt. Copy needs to go to president, treasurer, Beth Wallis. This must be in chapter name, not DTT. Federal tax 990N.

The Chair recognized Reporting Member, Laura Gullet to report on behalf of Delta Home. Delta Home has assisted 14 Delta sisters this past year. Each recipient is assigned to a director that is in contact with each recipient. 11 recipients received regular assistance with rent, mortgage, medical/dental, insurance, taxes, and monthly utilities. There is also a special gift fund for chapter and alumni dues. As of June 1, 11 are being assisted. Total benefits paid \$55, 777 in 2020-2021 and close to 3million since its inception. To qualify you

must be a member of DTT, active student/alumni membership cost \$2 yearly, or \$100 as a one-time payment. Laura asked that we contact Terry Shannon with eligible participants.

The Chair presented Shannon Loughmiller, National Philanthropy Committee to present a report regarding National Philanthropy. In summary, spend more time, have higher sales, and get more sisters! NFED was awarded all of the philanthropy money this year.
