By the time Emilia presented her check to Jodi in the hallway, during a break in the meeting, the donation had reached

\$102.50! Jodi was in tears. Emilia was also able to meet, Christina, a young lady effected by ectodermal dysplasia. Emilia's little heart that felt a need to help other kids, is so big! What I thought would be a nice little lesson for a 3-year-old, has turned into much more, not only for her, but for me and many others. Thank you to Beta Sigma for their donation! AND for their CHALLENGE to all Delta Theta Tau chapters. I read your note to Emilia and we are both excited to see where this goes. BTW – Emilia hasn't stopped putting coins in that jar and she can't wait to present another check to Jodi.

Some were Halloween-themed, others focused on sunflowers, and a very memorable one my chapter hosted was all about shades of green. Remind them that they have been investing \$2.00 every year for this program, and it's about time they take advantage of this fantastic benefit. The help Delta Home provides varies based on the sister's finances. Some of the bills we currently pay include mortgages, electric bills, health insurance premiums, help with retirement home rent, etc. With everything costing more, do you need financial help? Are you struggling to pay any of your bills?

So, who qualifies for the Delta Home? She'll need to:

Be 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances)

Be a DTT member for at least seven years

Have financial need greater than income

Have paid her Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 instead of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Laura Gullett, Delta Home Directorate President, for an

application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 260-251-1327 or email her at lagdtt@gmail.com. We take great care to make sure everyone's information remains confidential.

After we receive your application, we'll let you know if you are approved or not within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. The amount of assistance is based on your financial need and Delta Home Standing Rules.

Keep in mind that the most common reason we deny a sister help is when she is receiving Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home assistance may negatively impact Medicaid assistance.
