I left two little daughters home with grandparents as my husband was self-employed and daycare was an issue. I attended a few other national conventions over the years but was not a regular attendee until the past twenty years. I am the fourth member of my chapter, Mu Lambda, to have been elected to a national office. Ten years ago, my Mu Lambda sister, Dona Mostafa, was installed as National President. This year I was honored when Dona was the Installing Officer on our final day of convention.

We have been inspired over the years with the President's theme. The Presidents I have been fortunate to work with have been Jeri Elliott with "Opportunity for Kindness". Anita Waits with "She believed she could, so she did." Bonnie Wells with "Perfect Vision, Clear Mission." Julie Swoveland with "Sew Seeds of Friendship." Terry Riester with "Delts Rock – The Lemonade

Tour", and Julie Callis" Gathering, Growing and Giving with Grace and Gratitude." Each theme has provided guidance for the year as a member of Delta Theta Tau. These fabulous women each made their own unique contribution to our sorority.

The theme for 2023 -2024 is "Live a Lasting Legacy" and my hope is that it will cause you to consider that all you do in the name of Delta Theta Tau is part of your own personal legacy as well as the legacy of our organization. We will be 120 years old on October 16th! Don't you wonder if those five high school girls thought of legacies back in 1903? At some point in their lives, as our sorority continued, they must have wondered how it would change from a social club into a philanthropic organization.

We have much to be proud of in the ways we care for each other as well as our communities. We have reached beyond ourselves and discovered new ways to contribute to others' wellbeing. As far as I know, no member of Delta Theta Tau has been affected by ectodermal dysplasia, yet we have become a major contributor to NFED. We continue our relationship with this organization and still contribute to new annual projects every year. Last year we contributed \$610,522.16 and 96,372.9 hours in philanthropy. If you use a minimum wage of \$7.25, those hours convert to \$698,703.53 worth of services provided in our communities. That equals \$1,309,230.29. That is an amazingly awesome contribution from 68 active chapters!

Jenny's theme this year is Live a Lasting Legacy—what a great theme—and it's just what we do in Delta Theta Tau. A legacy isn't what we gain in life; it is what we leave behind. In DTT, we show our families and our communities how much we care with every project we complete and with every donation we make. We create a legacy of kindness, a legacy of compassion, a legacy of commitment to causes, a legacy of making those marks that cannot be erased.

One of the ways you can create a legacy within your chapter is to share how Delta Home helps our sisters financially. Look for signs that one of your sisters might be struggling. Maybe they don't have gas money to get to your meetings. Maybe they haven't been able to help with projects because of a medical condition they can't afford to see a doctor about. Or maybe that's you.

We all know that sometimes Social Security cannot pay all the bills. Sometimes retirement accounts come up short. Sometimes a husband's death leaves us in a tight place financially. These are

all places where Delta Home can step in and help.

So, who qualifies for Delta Home?

A member 60 or older (Except under exigent circumstances), and

DTT members who have been members for at least seven years, and

Members with financial need greater than income, and

Members who have paid their Delta Home dues of \$2 per year (Or paid \$100 instead of annual payments)

If you or someone you know might qualify, please contact Laura Gullett, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. Give her a call at 260-251-1327 or email her at lagdtt@gmail.com. We take great care to make sure everyone's information remains confidential.

After receiving your application, we'll let you know if you are approved within a few weeks. If approved,

assistance can start the following month. The amount of assistance is based on your financial need and Delta Home Standing Rules.

Remember that the most common reason we deny a sister help is when she receives Medicaid assistance. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home assistance may negatively impact Medicaid assistance.

As we go into the fall, show your gratitude to those who have paved the way for you to join DTT. Let them know about Delta Home and help them get and complete their application. That is a legacy you can be super proud of.

She boarded a train in Oakland, CA on Saturday evening, June 24th. A special our first Pullman car was reserved for Delts and at other stations, she was joined by members of other chapters. Upon leaving the Sacramento station, "we adjourned to the men's dressing room, of which we had the exclusive use, sat around and talked, smoked cigarettes and some liquid refreshments were enjoyed". Bridge was a favorite pastime also. During a six hour layover in Lincoln, Nebraska, arrangements

had been made for the ladies to go for a swim. "He had a taxi drive us to the club which was about 8 miles from town, wait for us while we had our swim, then take us back to town. Boy, the swim was good, especially the shower after. It felt grand to be clean again. I don't think I ever enjoyed a bath so much." On Wednesday, they arrived in Chicago. Katherine was met by relatives and given a tour of the town and dinner. Others went on to Detroit and some went to the World's Fair. "Thursday morning- first day of convention. We arrived at Detroit at 7:50 AM. We were taken to the Book-Cadillac in cars supplied by the Detroit chapter. During the first session of the convention "According to the constitution, a \$5.00 fine is imposed for national convention dues which are not in on time. However, since this has been an unusual year with the banks closing, a motion was carried to waive the fines." With the country in the midst of the Great Depression, these Delts still found a way to have a national convention. There is much more in this lengthy report, but I will end here. For Me, it gives a glimpse of life at that time, and of the workings of the sorority at that convention.






