If you or someone you know might qualify, please get in touch with Laura Gullett, Delta Home Directorate President, for an application or to ask questions. You can reach her at 260-251-1327 or lagdtt@gmail.com. We take great care to ensure everyone's information remains confidential.

After receiving your application, we'll let you know if you are approved within a few weeks. If approved, assistance can start the following month. The amount of assistance is based on your financial need and Delta Home Standing Rules.

Remember that the most common reason we deny a sister help is when she starts receiving Medicaid. Once a sister goes on Medicaid, Delta Home assistance may negatively impact Medicaid assistance.


